- Daily Lunch is served for children ages 0-17, it includes books and a craft activity
- Received two collections of books (48 titles in total) from the California State Library's First Partner Summer Book Club. This is an annual initiative to help children cultivate a love of reading and books
- Reinstated the Braille Institute Library partnership. Library users who are visually impaired may apply for this free service







Calexico Recreation Department

- Registration for swimming classes began on June 25th, classes begin on July 30th
- Update on Cordova Park and completion date set for mid-August to early September



- Budget amendment brought up to city council for Fund 255 - American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) for the replacement of an air conditioning unit at the community center
- Free glucose and blood pressure measurement at the Community Center on July 17th, 24th & 31st from 10:10 am to 11:00 am

- Placed banner at pool facilities to promote summer pool program

Calexico Fire Department

- Brush-11 back from deploy with one 1-Engineer
- 2670 ambulance patient compartment a/c not cooling was repaired and back in service
- NEW hire Firefighter Luis Escoto first week on in-house academy completed
- NEW hire Firefighter Chris Morales started academy
- Building at 352 E. 1st St caught fire on July 14th.
 Building is a total loss as well as a health and environmental hazard. Will reach out to ICAPCD for assistance
- NEW fire engine purchase request sent on July 17th
- 333 calls for service (July 1st-29th), 254 EMS calls, 66 service/false alarms/good intent calls, 13 fires (1 commercial fire and 12 rubbish/trash/brush fires)

Public Works Department

- Staff recommended purchasing 24 LED light fixtures for Daniel Gutierrez Field
- Contacted Imperial County Air Pollution Control District for possible funding for additional parking at Cordova Park
- Request for Proposal (RFP) for Demo & Asbestos Abatement Services for 311 Cesar Chavez scheduled
- Water main break occurred at 1000 Paulin Ave. Residents and businesses around the area are being affected. The Water Distribution crew will be working on the repair
- Fenced 352 E. 1st & Chamber of Commerce buildings for safety & security
- Sink hole on 1st St. & Heber Ave. addressed
