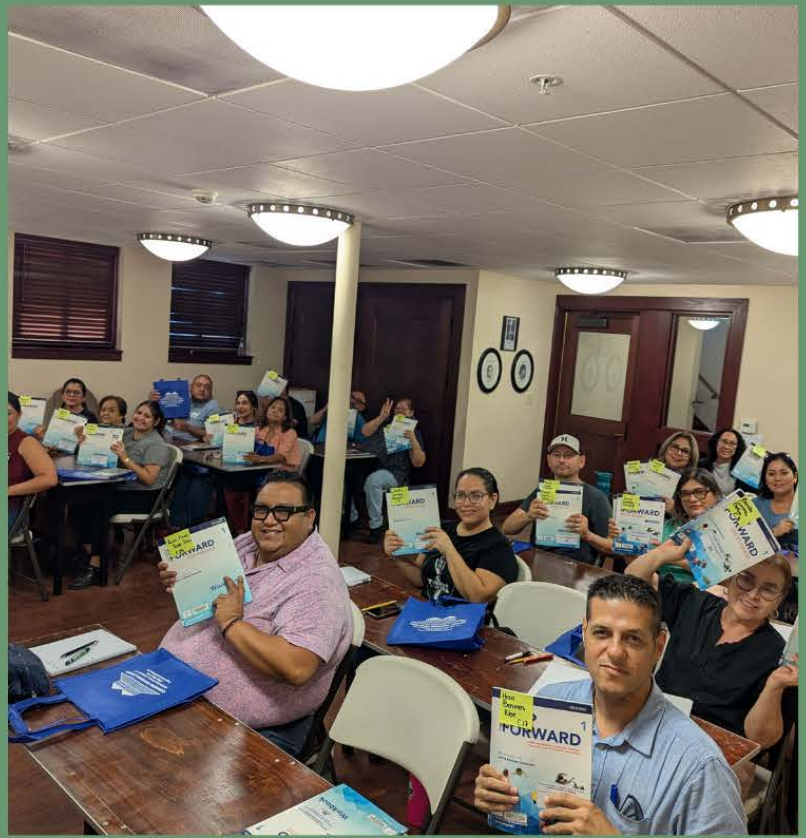
Tutor/Learner Interview
